Beginning Birding Walks


The hatchery's support has been great. Once again, they opened the Visitor Center in the winter for us. They've also helped with extra binoculars to share, in addition to ASK's loaners.

Bird highlights this year have included Ruddy Duck, Least Bittern, Wilson's Snipe, Broad-winged Hawk, Bald Eagle, Rusty Blackbird, Orchard Oriole, and Blackburnian, Bay-breasted, and Black-throated Blue Warblers. Sharp eyes spotted two Black Rat Snakes on last July's trip.

Earlier this month, the May BBW attracted 40 people, who found 52 bird species and a watersnake. Highlights were Solitary Sandpiper, Virginia Rail and 9 species of warblers.


Other Field Trips & Bird Walks

Bylaws Change Proposed

Section 3.3. Number. The Board shall consist of no more than eight (8) ten (10) and no fewer than six (6) Directors.

Section 3.4. Selection and Term. The terms of Directors begin July 1 following the annual meeting at which they are elected. The Directors who also serve as Officers will serve one-year terms, subject to resignation or removal. The term of the fifth Director, who will ideally be the immediate past president, will also be one-year, subject to resignation or removal. The terms of the other Board positions will, subject to resignation or removal, be three-years and will expire on a staggered basis with no more than one-third two-fifths of these Board positions expiring at any one time.






ASK's **Local Birding Spots** list was recently updated by Kent Martin. The list is incredibly helpful, easy to use and comprehensive! The list includes:
